There are lots of pieces and parts to the Advent and Christmas Season. As you read through the Parish Guide this month you'll find an event every Sunday. Whether its than Hanging of the Greens, Pictures with Santa, or the Christmas Cantata on the 24th, there are all sorts of celebrations and events to be a part of at church. And that's not to mention all the parts of Christmas and its story, wise men and shepherds and angels; its hard to tell the players without a score card.

The thing I encourage you to remember and invite you into this season is the simple truth of the season:

Jesus is not part of the story of Advent and Christmas, Advent and Christmas are part of the story of Jesus.

To that end I want to invite you on a devotional journey this Christmas. We have two opportunities. One is the personal devotional from the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches. Their 25 Day devotional for the 25 days of Advent will invite you to a deeper walk with daily reflections by Congregational pastors and lay people around the nation.

Second for those more technologically minded is the Hallow app on your phone or computer. The Hallow app (you can join for 90 days for free and can cancel after advent if you like) has readings from the works of C.S. Lewis read by Liam Neeson to highlight the story of Jesus in Christmas and Advent. It can be found at hallow.com and just search 'Lewis' or 'Advent'.



Advent Season is upon us, the most joyous time of the year. We at FCC have so much to look forward to, such joy to be found

Our "Hanging of the Greens" will take place on the first Sunday of the month, December 3rd, one of my favorite Sundays for sure. The season of Advent is at our door marked by its time of waiting... and preparation... and prayer... Missions is offering many opportunities to serve so that you may sense the Holy Spirit alive in you as you join us in our Christmas giving ministries.

We had the pleasure of hosting in our pulpit Maureen Philbin from the Fall River Deaconess Home and Katie Dawkins from Saint Vincent's Childrens Services to share thoughts about the vital work they do with the youth they serve. Imagine a child who has never experienced Christmas or their ethnic holiday, has never spoken of Jesus, or has never awoken to the thrill of a gift given especially for them. We had an inside look at the children, adolescents, and young families who typically find the holidays challenging and overwhelming only to wonder about the gift of love and hope for the season. Your Missions Committee will once again be funding the filling of Christmas stockings which will hang on the bedroom doors at Saint Vincent's on Christmas morning. In addition, we have a wish list available for you to review in the event you want to donate a little extra gift to bring wonder and excitement to a child That list is available in the vestibule alongside our mission's collection baskets.

We will also be holding our annual "PJs and Slippers" gifting event for the FR Deaconess "Hope for the Holiday" celebration. You may select a gift card funded by Missions with the initials and size of a child who can't wait to open toasty jammies on Christmas morning. You will find the cards trimming our sanctuary Christmas tree on Sunday December 3rd with the gift to be returned by December 10th.
