From Reverend Andy

How we participate in worship matters.

It is easy for us to just show up, to mumble through a few responses and prayers, and wait out the hymns to get the scripture and the sermon. It is an especially easy temptation to fall into as our worship is a traditional style. The songs don't have a familiar melody, and culturally, singing is something we all have come to reserve for the car, the shower, karaoke, the professionals, or not at all. And really, I get it, few of us are at home jamming out to Bach's Organ Fugue in G Minor.

Still, as we begin to lean into the summer months, we will look toward July and August with our worship starting at 9 AM again. We are also going to begin to contemplate how we engage in worship. I am not writing this as critique, "oh, you are all doing it wrong" but more as a loving invitation to deepen what you already experience. I'm hoping this summer can be an intentional experiment for you to up your worship game. To intentionally not do 'something different' but to lean into what we already do with more depth and weight.

If you're singing in worship is a challenge purposefully, commit yourself to deepening it, listen to others in the congregation who are singing and sing with them. If praying in church is a challenge, bring a prayer intention every week and offer it up to the whole congregation. If our unison responses seem rote or dry, look closely at what the words are saying and offer them up with boldness. If the service music or the choir responses seem unengaging, look at the title in the bulletin and close your eyes and really hear their depth and meaning. If the scripture reading and message are a challenge, try taking notes in the bulletin as a way of focusing your attention on the message. If all else fails and you continue to struggle to worship, simply take in the beauty of the building and let its elegance teach you a lesson. The entire service has within it deep and powerful moments inviting you to enter into each of them.

Again this is not suggesting you or we are failing or 'not doing it right' it's truly an invitation to deepening our discipline of worship. By way of that, we will be starting back up our liturgist service this summer. While I'm not sure what date we will kick it off it will be sometime in July or Agust. If you don't know the liturgist sits up front with me and helps lead the service by leading the responses and prayers, reading scripture and all around helping out. It is another way to deepen your experience of worship through serving, and it can be a lot of fun.

We are gathering names now, and if you're interested in participating as a liturgist please contact the office and we'll get some times together to discuss and get trained up. Whether you choose to be a worship leader or not, I hope you take the opportunity this summer to deepen your connection to your worship life, and in doing so deepen your faith, your connection to your church family and to Christ.




