From Reverend Andy

If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves; But when they attend to what he reveals, they are most blessed. – Proverbs 29:18 The Message

In the church calendar this is Easter season, this is a time of exploration of the meaning of the presence of the risen Christ that culminates in Pentecost, the birthday of the church on the 28th of May. Considered the "Great Fifty Days" of the encounter with the resurrection and bearing witness to it, the task of this Eastertide is what this proverb invites us to: to see what God is doing in bringing new life. Correspondingly, as the proverb suggests, to not see what God is doing is going to have us falling all over ourselves. The great task of the Easter season in the declaration "He is Risen!" is to attend to what God is doing in bringing new life.

In the words of John Robinson to the first pilgrims as they left Europe in search of a new land where they could be free, "It is my belief there is yet more light to be revealed from the word of God." How true his worlds from 402 years ago proved to be. The world has known growth and light unimaginable to Robinson in his time and so too is our task in our church today; endeavoring to see what God is doing and reveal some more light from the Word.

How do we attend to what God is doing? To me, the task is giving our selves the permission to dream. If the resurrection is anything it is the impossible becoming possible. It is not in great moments of clarity, like the Megatron speaking from on high, that the voice and vision of God comes to us but it in our own moments of daring to dream of what might be. Do we really see Jesus around the fire? Do we really find the gardener who turns out to be Christ? There is no greater irony than the irony of the resurrection; and the question of Eastertide is can we see it?

Elon Musk recently said in an interview, "The most ironic outcome is the most likely outcome." Knowingly or not, he was pointing to the greatest truth, the truth of all truths, that of Christ's resurrection. It's the reality of the world and if we are honest, it is the reality of our lives. The people we marry, who are kids become, what we do for work, if we cannot see the ironic, see the 'first may be last and the last may be first' reality woven into it all we need to look again.

We are blessed with the warmth of fellowship, with resources to make a difference, with beauty in our meetinghouse, and hands that regularly offer God's love to the world. But here in Eastertide, right now, what stands before us in the "Great Fifty Days" is an opportunity to attend to what God is revealing in our dreams and hopes for our lives and our church. If we don't, we risk, as the proverb suggests, falling all over ourselves and this will neither be joyful, fun, nor promoting the kingdom of God.

Let us look to the season and to the resurrection of Christ and attend to what God is revealing in this Easter. Let us look as a church for ways that new life is coming to be, and let us in our lives attend to how the deadness of our own life is coming to life. Spend some time imagining what God is bringing to life in our church and your life and may the Holy Spirit use us well in the building of God's kingdom, so that when the wind blows on Pentecost on the 28th the Spirit finds a home in us.


